Advantest

Advantest has donated \$100,000 to the New York City Fire Safety Foundation.

Aeon

The retailer has donated \$1,030,000 to the American Red Cross, and has also made a contribution to the Japanese business community relief fund.

The construction firm is now planning what form its aid will take.

Anritsu

The bank has donated \$100,000 to the Twin Towers Fund through its New York branch and is collecting contributions from employees, which are expected to exceed \$20,000. It is also waiving bank fees for customers who transfer money to its donation fund.

Shizuoka Gas

The company has donated employee contributions totaling more than \$5,000 to the Japanese Red Cross.

SMK

SMK has donated \$20,000 to the American Red Cross and to fire services. It is also matching employee contributions. Both the Japanese parent company and U.S. subsidiary are donating.

Sony

Sony has donated \$4,000,000 to the American Red Cross and the Twin Towers Fund. The group is also collecting contributions from employees for donation to the New York Community Trust and urging them to give blood.

Sumitomo Corporation

Sumitomo has donated \$500,000 to the American Red Cross and others and is collecting contributions from directors and employees. It also donated drinking water and is urging employees to donate blood.

Sumitomo Bakelite

Sumitomo Bakelite has donated \$100,000 to the Japanese Red Cross and American Red Cross (\$50,000 each from the parent company and its affiliate).

Sumitomo Chemical

The chemical company has donated \$70,000 to the September 11 Fund and Japan Chamber of Commerce and Industry in New York through its U.S. affiliate. The head office also has contributed to the Japanese business community fund.

Sumitomo Heavy Industries

Sumitomo Heavy Industries has donated \$2,000 and untallied individual employee contributions to the Japan Chamber of Commerce and Industry and the Japan Club. It has also contributed to the Japanese business community fund.

Sumitomo Mitsui Banking

The bank and three group affiliates have donated over \$122,000 to the New York Times 9/11 Neediest Fund and the New York Community Trust. The bank is waiving bank fees on transfers to an account established to collect relief funds, and is offering its services to help with missing persons information.

Suruga Bank

The bank has donated \$10,000 from its employees in Japan to the American Red Cross and waived bank fees for transfers to the Japanese Red Cross.

Suzuki Motor

The auto company is collecting contributions and has urged dealers also to participate. The final sum is scheduled to be donated to the American Red Cross together with contributions from its affiliates and their employees. It has also supplied vehicles for rescue work.

Taiho Kogyo

Taiho Kogyo has donated \$1,000 to the American Red Cross through its U.S. affiliate Taiho Corporation of America.

Taisho Pharmaceutical

Taisho has donated \$170,940 to the Japanese Red Cross and is considering further activities.

Takeda Chemical Industries

The pharmaceutical company has donated \$1,000,000 to the American Red Cross and is collecting and will match contributions from employees.

Takenaka

Takenaka's donation is now in planning. It is also considering support for fund-raising activities for the Japan Chamber of Commerce and Industry in New York.

Teijin

Teijin has donated \$10,000 to the American Red Cross through its U.S. affiliate Teijin Holdings USA.

Terumo

Terumo has donated an undisclosed amount to the American Red Cross Disaster Relief Fund and the fire and police services. It is also collecting and will match contributions from employees.

Toho Gas

Toho has donated \$5,000 to the Japanese Community WTC Fund through its New York office.

Tokai Rika

Tokai Rika and its U.S. affiliates have donated \$30,000 to the American Red Cross. Donations are also planned by the executive social club, management groups, labor unions, and employees.

Tokuyama

The company is collecting donations from employees.

Tokyo Electric Power

The power company has donated to the Japanese business community fund and has offered equipment to Consolidated Edison.

Tokyo Gas

Tokyo Gas has donated \$13,500 to the New York Chamber of Commerce and to the Japanese business community fund.

Tomen

Tomen is currently accepting donations from employees. A corporate donation is also being considered.

Tomoegawa Paper

Tomoegawa USA has made a \$600 donation to the American Red Cross, and employees are giving blood. A separate donation from the parent company is also under consideration.

Toshiba

Toshiba has donated \$1,000,000 to the NY State WTC Relief Fund, Twin Towers Fund, and the American Red Cross; its U.S. affiliates have added \$40,000 to this amount. It is urging employees to donate money and blood.

Toto

Toto's \$7,000 contribution to the American Red Cross includes a corporate donation and funds collected from employees. A contribution from the Morimura Group is also being considered.

Toyo Communication Equipment

This company has donated over \$100 to the American Red Cross. It also plans to collect donations from employees.

Toyoda Gosei

Three U.S. affiliates have donated a total of \$80,000 to the American Red Cross, and the Japanese parent firm is considering its own donation. Contribution-matching programs are in place for employees.

Toyo Seikan Kaisha

Toyo Seikan has donated \$1,500 to the Chicago Red Cross.

Toyo Tire & Rubber

The company directed its \$10,000 donation through the U.S. Consulate in Osaka. Donations are also being collected from employees. Additional donations from U.S. affiliates are being considered.

Toyobo

Toyobo has donated \$1,000 to the Japanese Chamber of Commerce and the Japan Club of New York, and is asking its employees to give blood.

Toyoda Machine Works

The company plans to donate over \$8,500 to the American Red Cross, including a corporate donation and funds collected from employees.

Toyota Motor

Toyota has donated \$1,000,000 to the American Red Cross. Donations are also being collected from employees of U.S. affiliates and the Japanese parent. Employee donations in the United States are being matched. The company has also offered trucks, forklifts, and the use of its harbor facilities.

Toyota Tsusho

This company has donated \$100,000 to the American Red Cross, with half coming from the parent and half from its U.S. affiliates.

UFJ Holdings

UFJ Holdings has donated \$100,000 to the United Way. It is offering on-scene assistance to corporations through the New York branch of the Sanwa and Tokai Banks.

Wacoal

Wacoal's New York subsidiary has donated \$40,000 to the September 11th Fund, the Twin Towers Fund, and the American Red Cross.

Wakamoto Pharmaceuticals

Wakamoto has contributed to the Japanese business community relief fund.

West Japan Railway

Donations are being collected from directors and employees, and will be delivered to the American Red Cross.

Yamaha Motor

Yamaha Motor has donated \$100,000 to the American Red Cross and is also collecting employee donations. The company has also provided 24 generators to recovery workers and is asking employees to give blood.

Yamanouchi Pharmaceutical

The U.S. affiliate is now planning a \$100,000 contribution, and is matching employee donations. The firm has also donated some \$14,000 worth of nutritional supplements to relief workers and established a fund to promote blood and other donations.

Yasuda Fire and Marine Insurance

Yasuda is collecting donations from employees in all group companies.

Yokogawa Electric

Some 40 companies and 25 sales outlets affiliated with Yokogawa are pooling donations from directors. The funds are to be put toward medical treatment via Project HOPE.

Yokohama Rubber

This tire manufacturer and its U.S. subsidiary have donated \$100,000 to the American RedCross. Donations are also being collected from employees.

NOTES AND STATISTICS

- Surveys were distributed to 1,191 member firms and associations. As of the compilation of this list, responses had been received from 217 companies and 6 associations. The list should not be taken as a definitive tally of the Japanese corporate community's relief efforts in the wake of the attack.
- The monetary contributions of the 223 firms and groups on the above list come to a total of \$36,057,525, or ¥4,218,730,425. This figure is exclusive of donations made to the fund organized by Keidanren (The Japan Federation of Economic Organizations) and other business organizations. That fund has reached a total of ¥443,290,000, or \$3,788,803 collected from 649 companies, as of the time this list was compiled.
- Many firms are also making donations in kind. Companies have contributed equipment, food, clothing, and other materials needed in recovery and relief efforts.
- In all, 41 of the responding firms and organizations were implementing matching programs for employee donations. Many firms, especially those with employees at subsidiaries or affiliates in the United States, are urging workers to donate blood, volunteer, and otherwise contribute individually to aid recovery efforts.
- Donations went to groups including the American Red Cross, the Japanese Red Cross, the Japanese Chamber of Commerce and Industry in New York, the September 11th Fund, the Twin Towers Fund, and police and fire rescue services in New York City.
